






The State of Christian Education for Kids – by Brady Horner

I gained a lot of my Bible knowledge and appreciation at a private elementary school. I regret to admit that it was my school, not the church, that instilled much of my Bible knowledge in me as a kid. Unlike church, the school gave me a daily lesson (rather than just Sunday and Wednesday). School also gave me grades, consistency, and accountability. This isn't to say that my Bible classes at church weren't valuable, but they lacked some things a school could provide.

In my churches growing up we typically had some nice volunteer teachers who made their own lessons, set their own agendas, and had longevity as the teacher in that class. Now as our culture has become busier and less committed to Church involvement/attendance, this has changed. It is difficult to get teacher volunteers, many people teach for short stints, and few are preparing their own lessons. I'm not complaining. I'm grateful for our volunteer teachers that teach and invest in our kids. Jackie works hard to make teaching easy, and what goes on in our classrooms is very important. However, these Church class changes will require changes elsewhere.

The parents are the first Bible teachers. Letting the kids watch Veggie Tales doesn't count! Parents have outsourced too much of their training to the church, media, and ministers (although I think these are all great resources). Interestingly, most churches are using "non-denominational" class materials. Any Church of Christ doctrine is passed down through slight curriculum changes, subtly communicated practices in church, and parents. As a youth minister I noticed that it was parents instilling Church of Christ doctrine/values more than any teaching of the church. I'm not sure what all needs to change in Christian education for kids, but I hope we are putting our best foot forward; first at the home as we invest in our kids, but second in Bible class. It is an honor to invest in kids and teach them the basic truths of our faith. I hope we can view that as a privilege, not a chore.
