Statement from the Elders

In case you missed it last Sunday, the elders announced the following:

S. 11th is very strong in missions, such as Sam's Place in Burundi, so we want Westgate to see and hear about the work they are doing and be able to pray for and support those missions. This Sunday is our last night of relengage. I am so grateful for the people who put this together, the servants who are leading groups, and the people who have committed their time and energy to tend to their marriages. The whole program has been beneficial in many ways, beyond just blessing our marriages; but one thing I have really admired is the commitment people have put forth. I have not seen that kind of commitment to anything church related since the '90s!

People were always there, not hit-and-miss like many other church services, classes, and events. People were generally on time. If people weren't going to make it, they would tell people and group leaders in advance. People made sacrifices to be there like coming home early from trips and saying "no" to other obligations. This was refreshing and made the experience much richer. This was one of those programs where you get what you put in. Those who didn't do the book work (or did it in the car on the way there) probably didn't benefit as much as those who prayerfully did it through the week and set aside intentional time to discuss it with their spouse.

Why were people so much more committed to this than other church gatherings/opportunities? It helped to have an end date. You only must commit to this for so long before you get a break...it's not a life sentence. There was a strong sense of accountability (which is lacking in our individualistic "you do you" culture). Some were doing this for their spouse and didn't want to let them down and group leaders held people accountable to attendance. People felt needed. Group discussion time is more life-giving when there are more couples there to share, laugh, encourage, and admonish. It felt important. People really want to bless, heal, and improve their marriages; this was not wasted time. I wonder if regular church gatherings aren't doing these things? Is what we are doing here a problem or is it a culture problem? I hope we can create a space here of accountability, where people feel needed, and where people believe what goes on with the Church family is important. Oh! and maybe we should work in a few more breaks!
