Nunchucks and Bibles – by Brady Horner

The New Ninja Turtles movies were released on Netflix this week! For some reason throughout its history, Ninja Turtles has been banned in some countries. Michelangelo's nunchucks were considered violent weapons! I find it strange that nunchucks were "violent" while a bo staff, sais, and katana blades weren't! Nunchucks are technically a defensive weapon used for disarming people.


Why are nunchucks worse than other weapons? The millennial in me thought, "It must be some kind of systemic racism against Asian people". Ok that's silly. I read that it was associated more with gang violence than other weapons. What gangs are fighting with nunchucks?! I remember playing with toy nunchucks as a kid (or making them out of whatever I could find) and I think I know the answer. They are hard to use without hurting yourself! Nunchucks have got to be one of the most dangerous weapons for the user. They swing around wildly and are likely to do more accidental harm to the user, other people, and inanimate objects. So maybe governments decided, "We can't let all these idiots have nunchucks!" Now the conservative in me says, "We should all have a right to hurt ourselves in any dumb way we please...I demand equal opportunity to nunchucks!"

Sometimes we refer to the Bible as our "Sword", based on Hebrews 4:12. It is a powerful illusion but it's frustrating when we use the Bible as an offensive weapon against people. Some only quote Scripture to tell people they are wrong. I don't love thinking of the Bible as a defensive weapon either. We shouldn't minimize Scriptures to a few verses that justify what we do and believe. Scripture is most powerful when it convicts us, not justifies our behavior. So, maybe calling the Bible our "nunchucks" is a fair (yet silly) analogy. Like nunchucks, if we use the Scriptures flippantly, without training, without full understanding, without guidance from those who have gone on before us, we misuse them and do damage to ourselves and others. May we use the Word of God to disarm. To disarm others, letting them know Scripture is ultimately good news used to bless, not condemn. To disarm ourselves, opening us up to Scriptures' convicting and transformative power.
