

Sermon Title: What God Can't Do

Scripture: Romans 8: 31-39

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? The journey to attend Lipscomb University this fall semester is still in progress. Since their Dominican visa will expire on July 12, they will have to leave the DR. They can't go back to Haiti now. They are going to another country in Central America hopefully not for too long while the attorney finishes working the case. We often don't know why we must face the daily trials of our lives, but we have faith that the Lord will bring us through victoriously.

multinational military intervention which we have been praying for and waiting for over three years. Yet, there's suspense about what will happen. Sendina Francois, an

eighth grader from CFC, when asked how she feels about all that tension, says, "I don't know if I will see tomorrow, but if I do, I won't stop thanking God because HE is the only one watching over me."
